The Life Education Programme

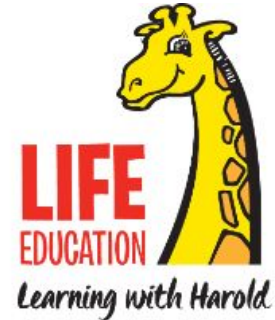
The Life Education programme teaches health to primary and intermediate school children. They go into schools by invitation and they are linked into the school curriculum. The programme covers a wide range of health topics:

- ❖ *Food and nutrition*
- ❖ *Body systems*
- ❖ *Self esteem*
- ❖ *Social relationships*
- ❖ *Substances*

They do this by taking children on an adventure in a mobile classroom that is equipped with sight and sound equipment designed to capture children's imaginations. The educators (registered teachers) take children on a journey, along with Harold the Giraffe, their mascot, and together they make the journey fun as well as educational.

The benefits your child will receive through the Life Education Programme.

- **HATS ON FOR TERM 4**

The School operates a Sun Safe Policy. This requires children to wear sun safe hats during the summer months (Terms 1 and 4). Children are only permitted outside if they are wearing a sun hat. The school has some sun hats but not enough for all children, it is preferable to **bring a hat from home (named)**. We provide sun block for all children.
