From the Principal's Desk

Dear Parent / guardian,

This is a reminder Friday is a public holiday for Matariki.

Last week we took a group of 9 runners to Poroutawhao for the annual Horowhenua Schools Cross Country.

All runners performed well with Pauly 1st year 6 boys, Braxton 2nd year 8 boys, Milla 3rd year 6 girls, Zara 5th Year 5 girls and Jahmen 5th year 8 boys with everyone else coming in within the first 20 runners.

One of the highlights of our week was having Jonny and Harold at school with the Life Education caravan.

Harold came to assembly on Friday and proved a real hit with the kids. Next term we are expecting a large influx of new entrants to start school in the junior hub and we are currently preparing for that.

At our BOT meeting on Wednesday last week, the board committed to upgrading playground facilities and shade sails which are big asset costs. We are also looking into an automated bell system which also has an intercom system in each room, for easier communication in emergencies such as earthquake, fire or lockdown.




Cross Country team who competed at Poroutawhao School
