Lunchtime: 12.45 to 1.15pm


1.15pm: continue events and finish with relays

Room 2 trip to the Manawatu Estuary

Magnificent Mud!

Anticipation and excitement filled room two on Friday morning as the students prepared to embark on their science excursion to the Manawatu Estuary. After learning about the estuary and its main inhabitants, students from room two set about completing a meter square survey, identifying and counting the plants and creatures within their meter square. This survey was facilitated by Peta and Dave, representatives from the Foxton Wildlife The survey assists them to Trust. determine the level of food available to the amazing array of birds who call the Estuary home. It was very muddy work, but the engagement, excitement, and



discoveries were plentiful. Pāpaka (Tunnelling Mud Crab) and the Tītiko (Mudflat Snail) were the most commonly found creatures on the day.

A huge thank you to our parent help volunteers, the team at Foxton Wildlife Trust, and to Manawatu College for lending us their van.
