Acknowledging positive behaviours

Kaupapa cards are given to students who have exhibited one of the following behaviours:

- Te Taha Whānau: looking after each other.

- Te Taha Wairua: doing things that look after our own spiritual well being, such as self-regulating to keep calm.

- Te Taha Hinengaro: looking after our mental wellbeing, such as trying hard in class.

- Te Taha Tinana: looking after our physical wellbeing.

Students collect their kaupapa cards during the week and put them in the House draw at assembly each Friday. Students have a kaupapa card drawn out

and they select a prize from the prize box.
