#### From the Principal's Desk

Dear Families,

This Friday school will be closed as we celebrate Matariki across New Zealand.

Matariki is a time for spending time with Family and whanau, honouring those who have passed away, sharing food and reflecting on the past year and setting goals for the future. To acknowledge this special time we will be preparing kai and enjoying waiata on Thursday morning in the Hall from 7.30am. All our tamariki are welcome to come to school early and enjoy a hot breakfast to be served at 8am.

Currently educators all over New Zealand are focusing on improving teaching and learning using structured literacy and structured maths approaches. The ministry of education is investing huge amounts of money to improve outcomes for students. Along with this is a focus on student attendance. Of course children should stay away from school when they are ill but more and more unjustified absences are being seen in both primary and secondary schools. Another growing trend is the amount of time lost due to late arrival at school. Here at Coley Street we have students regularly arriving up to 40 minutes after the bell has rung. This makes it very hard for your child to start the day feeling prepared and settled. It also causes a distraction to the other children in class that are already engaged in their learning. Staff are here by 8.15am and the bell rings at 8.45 am. Please have your child at school between these times. We all want them to have the best start to the day possible.

### Matariki Breakfast


Students are welcome to come into school early on Thursday for a breakfast feast to celebrate Matariki by sharing kai with their school whanau. Breakfast will be served at 8am.

### **BOARD OF TRUSTEE ELECTIONS** are coming up Term 3 ...

#### What is a school board of trustees?

Every school in New Zealand has a board of trustees.

Membership includes elected parent representatives, an elected staff representative and the Principal.

#### What do trustees do?

The board is accountable for student progress and achievement to its parents and community. They have the overall responsibility for the school. This includes legal obligations covering curriculum, property, personnel, finance and health and safety.

The board is the employer of all staff in the school, is responsible for setting the school's strategic direction in consultation with parents, staff and students, and ensuring that its school provides a safe environment and quality education for all its students.

Trustees are elected by the parent community by holding an election every three years and meetings are held once a month.
